The New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) has received reports that a soldier who was on leave has been killed in an incident in Ukraine.

At this early stage, there is still more information to be gathered in order to understand the circumstances fully.

The New Zealand Army will work closely with the family of the soldier to offer support at this deeply sad time.

The soldier was on a period of leave without pay at the time and was not on active duty with the NZDF.

The NZDF is currently consolidating information and will look to release further information when possible, and as such will not be able to provide someone for interviews at this time.

Please see the below update. With regards to the background information, please note that these points are for your background use only, not for publication.

We anticipate we will use the below information in future comms to wider media questions around the situation.

Any questions, let me know.

Background:

The NZ Army are engaged with the next-of-kin of the soldier. They will determine when they are comfortable on any announcement of their loved one's name and photo. We will be guided by them on timing however at this stage it appears they are OK with releasing his name in the coming days (subject to change, of course).

Talking points:

- I send my condolences to the family, friends and colleagues of the New Zealand soldier who has died in Ukraine.
- I have been advised the New Zealand Army will work closely with the family of the soldier to offer support at this deeply sad time.
- The New Zealand Defence Force has received reports that a soldier who was on leave has been killed in Ukraine.
- The soldier was on a period of leave without pay at the time and was not on active duty with the NZDF.
- At this early stage, there is still more information to be gathered in order to understand the circumstances fully.
- The NZDF is currently consolidating information and will look to release further information when possible, and as such will not be able to provide someone for interviews at this time.

Background information - not for publication

Why can NZDF not confirm one of their personnel has died?

The NZDF is currently working through how the soldier can be positively identified, noting the very challenging circumstances that are presented by this occurring in a conflict zone.

What does LWOP mean – is this person still legally serving in NZDF?

'LWOP' means 'leave without pay'. The NZDF has Defence Force Orders pertaining to LWOP. A member of the Regular Force who is on LWOP remains a serving member of the NZDF and is subject to the Armed Forces Discipline Act (AFDA) at all times.

What regulations is someone on LWOP or Reserve Force subject to?

The NZDF has Defence Force Orders pertaining to the entitlement to LWOP and obligations while on LWOP. Regular Force members and officers of the Reserves remain subject to the AFDA at all times. Non-commissioned members of the Reserve are not subject to the AFDA while they are on LWOP.

Note: This individual is a Regular Force soldier

Does NZDF keep track of where personnel on LWOP travel to?

Members of the Armed Forces are required to notify their chain of command of international travel plans when taking leave, however are not required to check in routinely.

Do personnel on LWOP have access to NZDF systems/equipment/uniform?

Members of the armed forces do not undertake duties while on LWOP, so do not have access to NZDF equipment or NZDF weapons during that time. A member on LWOP might access NZDF IT systems to maintain communications with their chain of command.

Can NZDF personnel go to countries such as Ukraine?

All members of the Armed Forces are required to communicate to their chain of command to seek approval to travel to any country that presents a security risk. Approval to travel to countries where there is an active armed conflict will generally not be approved.

Have any NZDF active service personnel gone into Ukraine?

How many NZDF LWOP/Reserve personnel is NZDF aware of serving in Ukraine?

- The NZDF is still inquiring into the circumstances of this particular case, including whether the soldier communicated his leave plans.

- No NZDF personnel on active service have entered Ukraine since this conflict began.
- The soldier who has reportedly been killed was not a member of any contingent who deployed as part of NZDF's support to the efforts in Ukraine.
- The NZDF does not know how many ex-serving personnel may have travelled to Ukraine. When a person leaves the Defence Force, the NZDF does not track their movements.

Please see the below media release – planned for release at 1300 today.

The highlighted line is currently with MFAT for confirmation so I will let you know if that changes or not.

Updated TPs for after the media release goes:

- We can confirm the soldier who was reportedly killed in Ukraine while on leave was Corporal Dominic Abelen. (Note: pronunciation is ABBA-LIN)
- Corporal Abelen was aged 30 and served with 2/1 Royal New Zealand Infantry Regiment (RNZIR) based in Burnham, and had served with the NZDF for 10 years.
- He was on a period of leave without pay at the time of his death and was not on active duty with the NZDF.
- Corporal Abelen has been described as a quality junior non-commissioned officer, and someone
 who genuinely cared for his soldiers and friends.
- Uniformed personnel are required to notify their chain of command of international travel plans
 when taking leave without pay, however are not required to check in routinely.

- The NZDF is still inquiring into the circumstances of this particular case. Corporal Abelen's leave request did not include plans to travel to Ukraine.
- When a uniformed member of NZDF takes leave without pay, they are still considered to be serving, and are subject to various Defence Force Orders. They are able to go and pursue other employment opportunities during this time and travel, with approval required to enter some countries (including Ukraine).

FURTHER DETAILS RELEASED ON NZDF SOLDIER REPORTEDLY KILLED IN UKRAINE

The New Zealand Defence Force (NZDF) can confirm the soldier who was reportedly killed in Ukraine while on leave was Corporal Dominic Abelen.

Corporal Abelen, 30, served with 2/1 Royal New Zealand Infantry Regiment (RNZIR) based in Burnham, and had served with the NZDF for 10 years.

He was on a period of leave without pay at the time of his death and was not on active duty with the NZDF.

Acting Chief of Army Brigadier Rose King said the New Zealand Army's thoughts were with Corporal Abelen's whānau, friends and colleagues at this difficult time.

"Any loss of one of our whānau is deeply felt across the New Zealand Defence Force. We are concentrating our efforts on supporting Corporal Abelen's loved ones and our personnel as they grieve," she said.

The NZDF is supporting consular officials in respect of possible options regarding formal identification and repatriation, noting the very difficult circumstances of doing so in a conflict zone.

Commanding Officer of 2/1 RNZIR Lieutenant Colonel Cory Neale said Corporal Abelen was a well-liked and respected soldier who had deployed to Iraq during his time in service.

"Corporal Abelen was a quality junior non-commissioned officer, a trusted go-to member of his company

and an absolute character who genuinely cared for his soldiers and friends. He will be missed, but also remembered long into the future."

The NZDF is unable to comment on the circumstances of the incident itself as Corporal Abelen was not on active duty and as such the NZDF will not be fronting anyone for an interview.

They respectfully request not to be approached for interview.

Dominic was in the NZ Army for 10 years but never got to fight for his country.

He didn't tell us he was going to Ukraine until he was there. He knew we would talk him out of it. He also knew the risks of going there but still went to fight for them.

That is Dominic, always thinking of helping others.

We understand why he went and hold no grudge against the NZ or Ukraine Army and fully support what he did.

Dominic loved being in the army, the life-long friends he made there.

There has been relentless support from half the Burnham Military Camp that knew him, as well as personnel from overseas.

A kind, gentle man with the most infectious smile that you couldn't help but smile back.

He had a love of the outdoors and did a lot of tramping. He spent his holidays traveling around New Zealand and the world.

I'm extremely proud of my children and especially Dominic for standing up and doing what he thought was right. He leaves a massive hole in all our hearts.

Below are a collection of statements from his sister and brothers who thought the world of him:

"The most amazing human being and the buffest Abelen with the biggest heart to match. Makes everyone he knew immensely proud. The embodiment of drive and power"

"I am so proud to call you my brother, I knew you always wanted to risk your life for what you believe in. You proved that so I won't be sad that you are gone but proud that you lived the life of a hero."

"Dominic, my brother is more than just another soldier, he is the most bold, brave and beautiful human with the quickest wit and freely given laugh. Our hearts are broken. He sacrificed his life for others to have a life."

"He was a standard high achiever in all aspects of life. Not only was he my big brother, my role model, my support, but he was for many others too. He took the army brotherhood to a new level, showing it's not about how hard you are but how hard you work. Actions speak louder than words and Dom had said more than enough."

"He was a career driven man, a reliable brother who always had our backs, a favourite and very much loved uncle to a nephew who is waiting for him to come home..."

Reactive: If asked about former NZDF pers in Ukraine:

The NZDF does not collect information regarding an individual's subsequent employment on leaving the armed forces, with the exception of formal transfer of security clearances. The NZDF does not know how many ex-serving NZDF personnel may have travelled to Ukraine. When a person leaves the Defence Force, the NZDF does not track their movements.

s. 9(2)(a) (RNZ)

What are you doing to check how many current NZDF soldiers or any other serving personnel in the defence force are fighting (or providing support) in Ukraine. These could be people on leave without pay (or paid leave). The NZDF has begun contacting personnel who are on Leave Without Pay (LWOP) to remind them of their obligations under the conditions of LWOP.

Are you doing anything to check the whereabouts of any defence force staff on annual leave overseas to ensure they are not in Ukraine without permission.

The NZDF are considering a range of options to check in with all personnel to remind them of their obligations as well as restrictions on travel to countries that present a security risk.

What are you going to do to stop this happening again?

Members of the Armed Forces are afforded the rights applicable to all New Zealanders. These include those rights contained in the New Zealand Bill of Rights Act (including the right to freedom of movement, travel, and freedom of association). The only limitations to those rights would be where it can be demonstrably justified in relation to the efficient and disciplined operation of the Armed Forces. As such, the NZDF are seeking to do what is practicably possible to reach out to personnel who are on leave without pay to advise of their obligations, however this process relies on the individual in being forthcoming with accurate information.

Are you currently checking:

- ... how many soldiers are on annual leave (or leave without pay)? As at 25 August 2022 there are 94 personnel across all three Services were on leave without pay. It is not known how many NZDF personnel on leave without pay may be in Ukraine. No personnel have been approved by the NZDF to enter the country. NZDF personnel are required through orders to inform us of any intent to enter a country that represents a security risk (including Ukraine). The NZDF does not independently track the movements of personnel on leave without pay.
- ... how many are overseas? TBC
- ... how many have sought approval to travel to Ukraine? None
- ... how many been declined? N/A

- ... how many soldiers have been in Ukraine and informed/notified you (while there)? None
- ... how many soldiers have <u>returned</u> from being in or fighting in Ukraine and then informed/notified you (after the fact)? None

Also:

- What is the penalty for fighting in other countries without permission?

Regular force members on leave without pay remain subject to the Armed Forces Discipline Act at all times, and therefore also remain subject to applicable military orders. How contraventions are dealt with under the AFDA will be dependent on the particular circumstances of the case.

- What does the rules or soldiers contracts say about this type of thing (fighting overseas)?

Defence Act 1990, s 22, provides for the transfer of members of the Armed Forces for employment with other forces. S 22 requires that a transfer order is to be authorised by a New Zealand authority. Corporal Abelen did not have authority to transfer.

Defence Force Order (DFO) 3 provides orders for 'paramilitary employment' (PE). PE is widely defined and means "any employment, engagement, or involvement in an enterprise within any area of operations that is organised along military lines, or appearing to be of a military nature, outside of the auspices of the New Zealand Government". DFO 3 also provides that "The NZDF will not approve paramilitary employment of a security or law enforcement nature".

- Can you supply me with a copy of the rules/contract with sections pertaining to it? This can be provided (DFO 3)

Does NZDF know how many current serving (including on unpaid leave etc) staff are in Ukraine? NZDF has not been made aware of any serving personnel (including those on leave without pay) in Ukraine.

And how many is this? Is it known how many are in combat roles and if so how many? n/a

- What is the advice to serving NZDF staff about heading to Ukraine? Is it encouraged or considered permissible?
 The NZDF would not seek to approve any NZDF personnel requests to enter Ukraine at this current time. Personnel are advised to not enter the country.
- What are the requirements and rules around NZDF soldiers fighting in conflicts abroad? Defence Act 1990, s 22, provides for the transfer of members of the Armed Forces for employment with other forces. S 22 requires that a transfer order is to be authorised by a New Zealand authority.

Corporal Abelen did not have authority to transfer.

Defence Force Order (DFO) 3 provides orders for 'paramilitary employment' (PE). PE is widely defined and means "any employment, engagement, or involvement in an enterprise within any area of operations that is organised along military lines, or appearing to be of a military nature, outside of the auspices of the New Zealand Government". DFO 3 also provides that "The NZDF will not approve paramilitary employment of a security or law enforcement nature".

- If a soldier takes leave to do other work, must NZDF be informed and/or approve of this? Yes
- In the case of Mr Abelen, was the NZDF aware he was in Ukraine? Did Abelen inform NZDF of this? As per previous information released, the NZDF was not aware Corporal Abelen was in Ukraine.
- If a soldier was to travel to Ukraine, what if any support does NZDF provide them? None.
- Has the NZDF confirmed whether any other serving personnel on leave without pay are in Ukraine? If so, how many?

The NZDF has begun contacting personnel who are on Leave Without Pay (LWOP) to remind them of their obligations under the conditions of LWOP.

As at 25 August 2022 there are 94 personnel across all three Services were on leave without pay. It is not known how many NZDF personnel on leave without pay may be in Ukraine. No personnel have been approved by the NZDF to enter the country. NZDF personnel are required through orders to inform us of any intent to enter a country that represents a security risk (including Ukraine). - Will the NZDF be "checking in" or confirming the whereabouts of serving soldiers on leave without pay, in order to establish if any others, or how many may be in Ukraine?

- If so, when will this be done and how long could it be expected to take? What action will be taken if soldiers have travelled to Ukraine?

It is unclear how long it will take to contact all personnel on leave without pay as the NZDF does not independently track the movements of personnel on leave without pay.

Members of the Armed Forces who are involved in any operations appearing to be of a military nature that is outside the auspices of the New Zealand Government may have a range of outcomes. Examples could be that they are subject to a change of circumstances report provided to the Directorate of Defence Security, have their retention in service reviewed immediately or be subject to investigation and potentially disciplinary action.

- If not, why not? Does the NZDF not want to know if serving personnel have entered Ukraine?

Does the NZDF know how many NZ soldiers, not associated with the training programme, are in Ukraine while not on active duty?

No NZDF soldiers associated with the training programme are currently in Ukraine, nor do they plan to be. NZDF personnel deployed in support of Ukraine have been deployed to the United Kingdom and Europe. They do not enter Ukraine. The NZDF is unaware at this time of any NZDF personnel not on active duty in Ukraine, however is working to confirm information around this.

- are you please able to provide the number of NZDF staff who have taken leave to go to Ukraine? Including a breakdown of their roles?

The NZDF has not been made aware of any personnel who have taken leave to go to Ukraine, as disclosed by the individual.

As at 25 August 2022 there were 94 personnel across all three Services were on leave without pay (LWOP) however this number is dynamic and is subject to change as some may return from LWOP and some may go on LWOP. The NZDF is unable to confirm this exact number for the reasons mentioned above, but also because the NZDF does not independently track the movements of personnel on leave without pay. It would be accurate to say the majority of those on LWOP have been contacted by NZDF.

The NZDF are seeking to do what is practicably possible to reach out to personnel who are on leave without pay to advise of their obligations, however this process relies on the individual in being forthcoming with accurate information.

Currently, no personnel on LWOP who have been contacted by NZDF have indicated they are either in Ukraine or seek to travel there.

No NZDF personnel currently on leave without pay who have been contacted by the NZDF have reported being in Ukraine.
