On Tuesday 26 March 2019 at 5.00pm, New Zealand House, London, His Excellency Lieutenant General Sir Jeremiah "Jerry" Mateparae, GNZM, QSO, KStJ, High Commissioner of New Zealand welcomes Air Marshal Mike Wigston, CBE, Sir Matthew Pinsent, CBE, Henley Royal Regatta Steward and Dr CIJ Hartley, The King's Cup Organising Committee.

Air Marshal Mike Wigston will speak about the essential contribution of women in the UK Armed Forces, reflected in the unique arrangements for the King's Cup. He will highlight how defence engagement activities in partnership with the defence community contributes to this and how it is integral to the Armed Forces' overall mission and societal support.

Sir Matthew Pinsent will draw upon his achievements as both a broadcaster and winner of four consecutive Olympic gold medals to illustrate how sport can be a developer of character and a catalyst for societal change. He will highlight the contribution of Henley Royal Regatta to equality and opportunity in both 1919 and 2019 and the investments made to enable three million uniformed personnel in the competing nations to connect with The King's Cup.

Chris Hartley will walk through the programme for the return of The King's Cup in 2019 involving military crews from the UK, USA, Canada, New Zealand, France, Germany, Netherlands and Australia. Chris will illustrate how this event honours our past, celebrates our militaries' 'fittest and finest', mirrors the opportunities for women in the military, makes an enduring contribution to strategic alliances and leaves a substantive legacy. He will cover the inevitable costs involved, charitable status and government audit assurance as well as critical dates, political and diplomatic invitations, and opportunities for involvement and media. He will give a privileged brief on the engagement of two Royal Households and the USA's first President George Washington, as well as the remarkable contributions from the other nations.

Defence Attachés from Australia, Canada, France, Germany, Netherlands, New Zealand and the USA will be invited to introduce the involvement of their respective Chiefs of Defence, background and the name of their national crew.

Military athletes attending the event will also be called upon.

The CEOs of all the major UK based defence corporations are invited as well as those major corporations with activities in the UK and links back to each of the competing nations.

Guests will be asked to lend their palates to a blind tasting in order to choose a celebratory private label 'Early Landed' Grand Champagne vintage cognac.

THE KING'S CUP RETURNS TO HENLEY AFTER 100 YEARS

Eight military forces - Australia, Canada, France, German, New Zealand, Netherlands, UK and USA - will compete in this year's The King's Cup at Henley Royal Regatta.

Please find attached the updated King's Cup programme with key dates and activities plus an overview below of various progress.

On boats I have signed a contact for eight boats to be delivered for the Regatta. It is immeasurably better if all crews row in the same boat but I am also very conscious that it is a tight timetable so I will ask the four European based crews to still quarantine two boats each as a fall back.

On oars we have only received offers to hire them but Sir Steve Redgrave is to make a personal request to one or more oar manufacturers if they will support The King's Cup crews with oars for the Regatta. As yet I do not have a fallback plan.

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On transport the Regatta's partnership with Aston Martin has caused a slight delay including on the discussions with JaguarLandRover but this is being sorted. At this stage here is no chance crews will get an Aston Martin each ...

On accommodation this remains with the UK Armed Forces but I am also looking at contingency plans.

I have an unshakable optimism that the current and sizeable funding gap will be met by those in the defence industries as part of their societal contribution and ongoing licence to operate. A number of national military organisations are constrained in their ability to give email contacts of military suppliers, never mind pass on requests for funding. If you know of others who can assist, those contacts would be appreciated. In the absence of this, a concerted effort to publicise your own activities and the challenge of The King's Cup within the military and external arena really helps. We will crowd source the required contacts otherwise.

All nations have made some quite extraordinary contributions to the prizes and these are received or known to be in transit. Cost of manufacture including the precious metals involved of all prizes is in excess of £50,000.

On Monday 25th March AM UK time a press release announcing the names each crew will race under will be issued and The King's Cup website will be launched. The press release and the page describing each crew has been prior circulated to each of the national media contacts with a request that the release is distributed and amplified by each nation.

On Tuesday evening 26th March in the New Zealand High Commission we will outline The King's Cup programme to the diplomatic, media and military communities. This was the event originally scheduled at Australia House but changed as a consequence of logistical difficulties. Air Marshall Mike Wigston, soon to be Air Chief Marshal Mike Wigston, will speak on the role of women in defence and the pivotal contribution of The King's Cup. Please see the brief below.

Each nation, most through their London Ambassador/High Commissioner, have designed an individual to attend this event and speak to their crew, national contribution and racing intent. They have also been asked to nominate national media contacts in London. If there are additional guests that you would like to invite even at this late stage I will endeavour to include them. It may be that we are able to live stream the event in which case I will send you a link.

Consequent on BREXIT developments the UK Secretary of State is also hoping to attend.

I will be bringing the Leander crew along to Tuesday event to bring additional height and weight. A number of them are World Championship medalists and Henley/ Boat Race winners. They have been instructed to vocally support the event so we will see if they do so in the appropriate places. I have also pinched some silverware from Henley Royal Regatta for the evening and dragooned a couple of Doggett's Cap and Badge men in their (tight) red tunics and (oversize) silver armlets. These are winners of the oldest rowing race in the world, rowed by professional watermen on the Tideway section of the Thames. since 1715. In May it is these men who will deliver your enamelled competitor badges to each High Commissioner/ Ambassador.

I have been in contact with Debbie Howarth and went to see **\$.9(2)(a)** in London. Neither have been able to give me any contact details for defence industry in NZ, NZ CEOs in NZ or CEO's in other countries like the US and the UK with an interest in NZ. Zero contacts to date from New Zealand. This has proved quite a challenge as without this help my chances of getting past the corporate reception area are slim despite my ongoing efforts.

Thank you again for your help and support last month

Before the NZ crew arrives in June three events are planned in the UK and one in Australia.

- On the 7th of May in Canberra at 17.00 the Ambassadors and High Commissioners to Australia and their Defence Advisors are invited to a reception to listen to Australia's most senior military commanders and background on The King's Cup. As in March, the Defence Attaché will be asked to introduce the support from your Chief, the name of your crew and the background to the outstanding contribution New Zealand has made to the prizes. Please forewarn your colleagues in Canberra of this event and date as it is important that there is a New Zealand presence please. An invitation to them and location will follow shortly.
- On the 21st May, at a time to be advised and accompanied by Thomas Doggett Cap and Badge winners and Stewards of Henley Royal Regatta, I will be formally presenting the specially commissioned numbered enamel competitor badges at New Zealand House. We will be visiting seven Embassies and the Ministry of Defence that day and I will coordinate our arrival with your Defence Section and your media team. It will make for a very colourful photo opportunity and it may be useful to have identified an appropriate location at the High Commission for this.
- At a date to be advised you are invited to join Secretary of State Gavin Williamson in King Henry VIII's wine cellar to physically contribute to the manufacture of The King's Cup prizes. We await advice on the date but this may be the 23 May.



Background:

The King's Cup is an international military rowing race at Henley Royal Regatta in July 2019 that honours our past, celebrates eight nations' fittest and finest and catalyses the opportunities for women in defence.

Her Majesty The Queen is Patron of Henley Royal Regatta. The world's finest regatta is in its 170th year and remains an essential part of the English summer season.

The King's Cup is the first time that military women and men will row in the same boat at an elite event in front of 100,000 spectators and live-streamed to a potential audience of three million in uniform. It echoes the race that in 1915 helped the allies build the peace; in 2019 Germany and the Netherlands will join the original competitors from the USA, UK, Australia, New Zealand, France and Canada.

Military chiefs of the eight nations will attend the Regatta.

Each nation has contributed something of high symbolic value to be melted down and combined as part of the prizes

International women in defence, The King's Cup and making history

On Tuesday 7th May 2019 at 5.00pm for 5.15pm, in the Captain Reg Saunders Gallery at the Australian War Memorial, Canberra, Air Marshal Warren McDonald CSC AM will speak about the essential contribution of women in the Australian Defence Force, reflected in the unique arrangements for the return of The King's Cup and their participation in eight nation's military crews.

The King's Cup is an international military rowing race between eight nations at Henley Royal Regatta that honours our past, celebrates our eight nations' 'fittest and finest', and catalyses the opportunities for women in defence. In 1919 Australia won the event in the UK, it is being reraced one hundred years on and for the first time with serving men and women rowing in the same boat

Australian dual Olympic medalist and oarsman Cameron McKenzie-McHarg will add his perspective on what makes Henley Royal Regatta second only to the Olympics as a sporting competition and athlete experience, highlight the importance of the 1919 victory to Australia and comment on the prospect of a return to Australia of The King's Cup in 2019.

In a video presentation Henley Royal Regatta Steward Sir Matthew Pinsent CBE will draw upon his achievements as a winner of four consecutive Olympic gold medals to illustrate how sport can be a developer of character and a catalyst for societal change. He will highlight the contribution of Henley Royal Regatta to equality and opportunity in both 1919 and 2019 and the investments made to enable three million uniformed personnel in the competing nations to connect with The King's Cup.

Dr Chris Hartley, Chairman of The King's Cup Organising Committee will walk through the programme for the return of The King's Cup in 2019 involving military crews from the UK, USA, Canada, New Zealand, France, Germany, Netherlands and Australia. He will cover critical dates, political and diplomatic invitations, and opportunities for involvement and media. He will give a privileged brief on the engagement of two Royal Households and the contribution from USA's first President George Washington, as well as the remarkable items incorporated into the prizes from all nations including a poignant contribution from Australia.

The Ambassadors, High Commissioners and Defence Attachés from the USA, France, Canada, Germany, Netherlands, UK and New Zealand are invited to attend; the Defence Attachés requested to introduce the involvement of their respective Chiefs of Defence, their crew background and race aspirations. Military athletes attending the event will also be called upon.

All guests will depart with a suitable liquid refreshment tied directly to the experience of Australian troops in WW1.
