I refer to your email of 13 August 2025 requesting, under the Official Information Act 1982 (OIA):

I would like to request under the Official Information Act the generally accepted nicknames given to vessels past and present in the New Zealand Navy.

The Royal New Zealand Navy (RNZN) does not have official nicknames for its vessels.

However, a three-letter designation is used as shorthand for RNZN vessels. Enclosure 1 provides the relevant designations for recent RNZN vessels. More information on historic RNZN vessels can be found in RJ McDougal's book, *NZ Naval Vessels*, published in 1989. Copies of this book are held in the National Library in Wellington.
